

### **Updated Table of Contents Information Available Automatically**

By setting up an alert in *Web of Science*, you can regularly receive email table of contents information on the journal or journals of your choice. Web of Science has over 8500 journal titles available through its *Arts & Humanities*, *Social Sciences*, and *Science Citation Indices*. To set up this service, visit our tutorials page:

### **Help Build the Library's Collection**

UC Merced's Library regularly receives new materials through our collection-development plan with Yankee Book Peddlers (YBP). You can be involved in recommending materials for purchase through GOBI alerts. These email alerts include titles above and beyond those regularly purchased for the subject areas supported at the university. Some faculty members are already using GOBI alerts to put their stamp on the Library's collection, and those who aren't yet participating are welcome to join.

#### **What is involved?**

You will receive a weekly email that directs you to an online listing of recent books in your subject area. Scroll through the list, mark the items you would like the library to consider purchasing, and click on "Submit." That's all there is to it.

#### **How do I sign up?**

Email us at [library@ucmerced.edu](mailto:library@ucmerced.edu) with the subject area(s) for which you would like to receive alerts. Soon you will start receiving the weekly alerts. At any time you can adjust the subject areas for which you receive books.

### **Supplemental Course Resources (SCR)**

The SCR program is designed to provide online access to materials that supplement, rather than replace, the required texts for a course. Students can access supplemental course readings through UCMCROPs.
